Help our bees and butterflies this year

In the UK we have lost 25% of our widespread butterflies in just 40 years. Iconic pollinator species such as bees are struggling to survive.

There is still time to plant wildflower seeds to provide the essential nectar and pollen throughout this summer. Choose native flowers or cultivars of native species to benefit the most wild pollinators.

Provide a mix of flower types to cater for all. Open, daisy-type flowers and umbels are great for hoverflies and many solitary bees, whilst some other bees, butterflies and moths prefer tubular flowers. Also plant night-scented flowers for moths, such as Jasmine and Honeysuckle. More info at:

Food Glorious Food

The Biblical landscape is peppered with meal stories. From an early age Jesus joined His family in celebrating the annual cycle of Jewish festivals and feasts. Celebrating the Passover was His last meal.

Every year we experience the cycles of the natural world as spring gives way to summer and summer lengthens into autumn and it is likely that we associate certain meals with different times of year.

There are many traditional Christian festivals which have been lost through time, each associated with certain foods; January – celebrate *Plough Sunday* with a ploughman's lunch, February – *Candlemass and Lent*, pancakes and oatcakes.
